Gestalt Theory

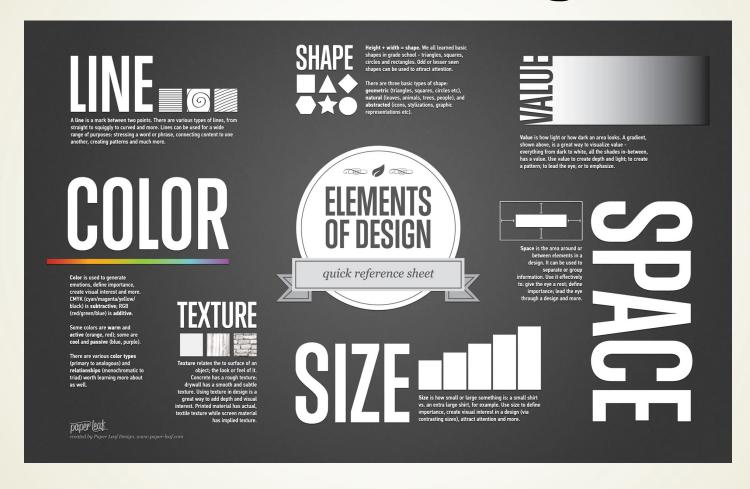

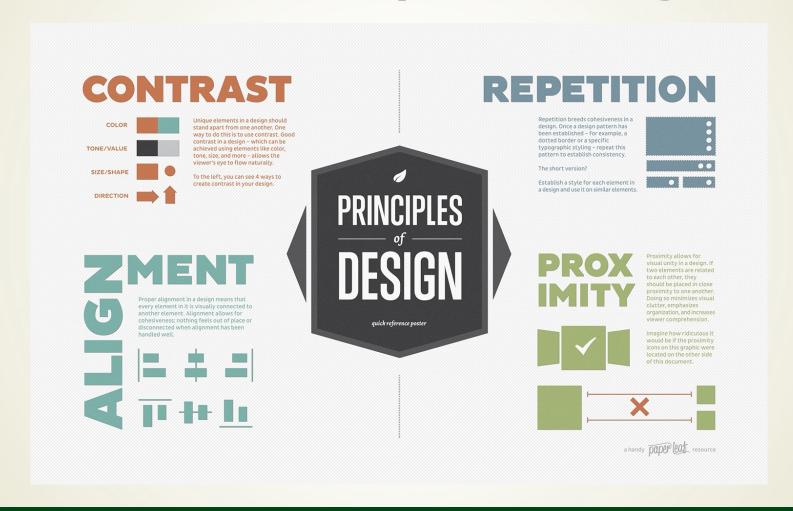

Contrast

If two elements are different, make them very different

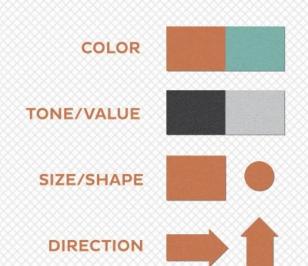
Vary size, typeface, emphasis, background, color, texture, etc.

If everything looks the same, nothing is emphasized

Espn.com – nav links vs. headlines vs. feature link

Colors, backgrounds, fonts and all different from each other

CONTRAST

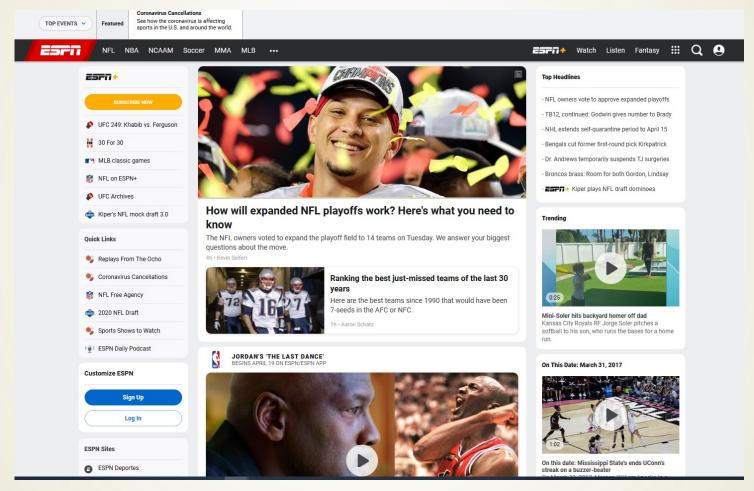


Unique elements in a design should stand apart from one another. One way to do this is to use contrast. Good contrast in a design – which can be achieved using elements like color, tone, size, and more – allows the viewer's eye to flow naturally.

To the left, you can see 4 ways to create contrast in your design.



Contrast



Repetition

Items performing same function should look very similar

Repetition gives identity

Suggest templating system

Also has load time implications—reuse of graphics

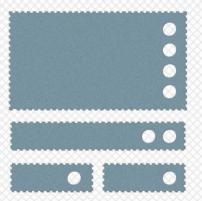
Si.com – headlines styled the same, consistent style and layout across pages

REPETITION

Repetition breeds cohesiveness in a design. Once a design pattern has been established – for example, a dotted border or a specific typographic styling – repeat this pattern to establish consistency.

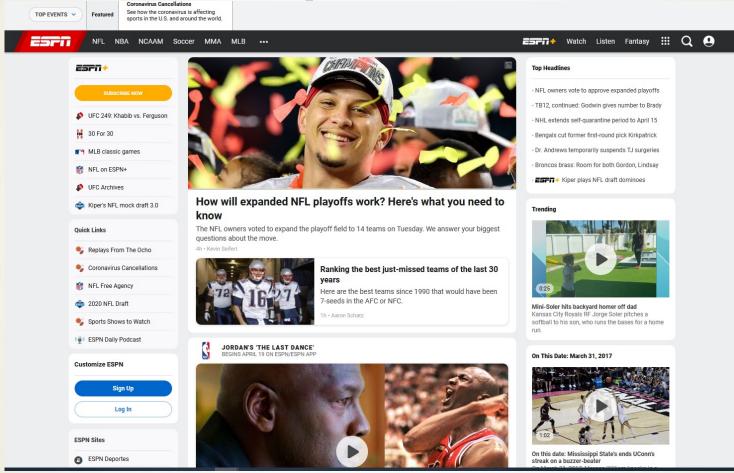
The short version?

Establish a style for each element in a design and use it on similar elements.

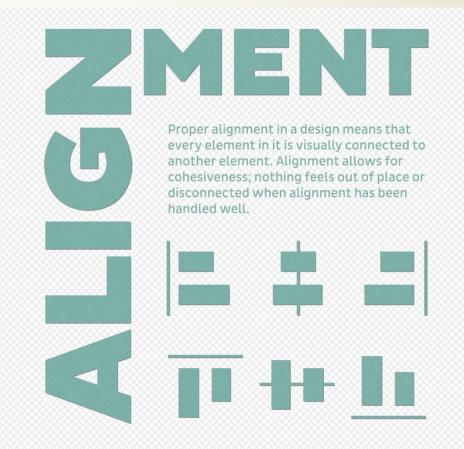

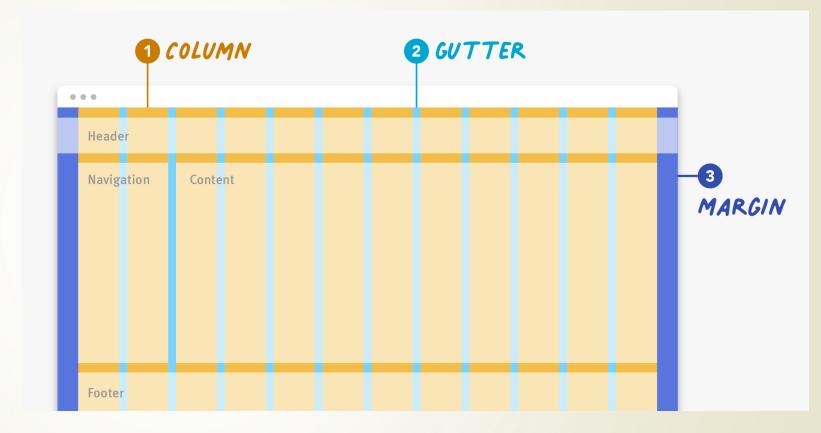

- Objective, unemotional organization to a graphic design

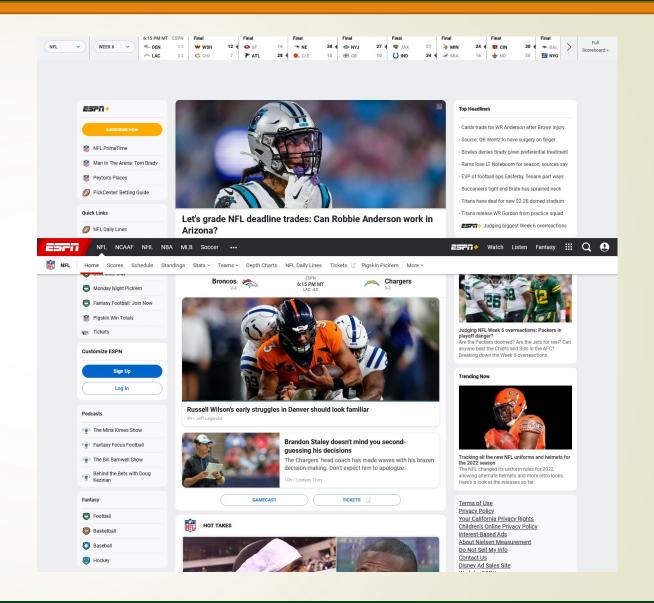

Proximity

Items near each other are seen as a unit

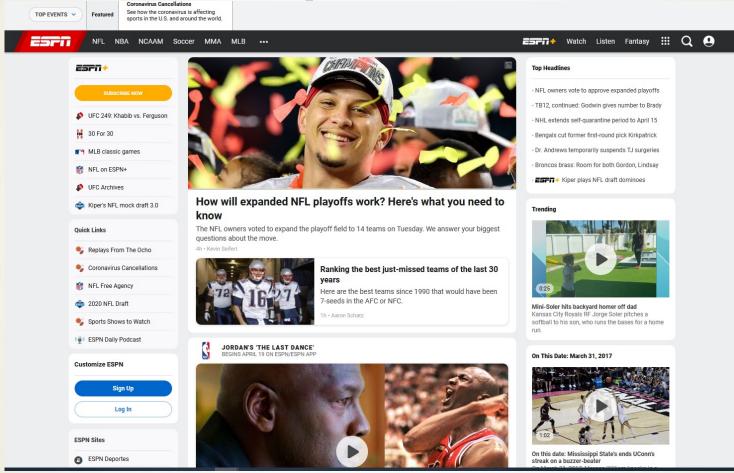
Proximity allows for visual unity in a design, If two elements are related to each other, they should be placed in close proximity to one another. Doing so minimizes visual clutter, emphasizes organization, and increases viewer comprehension.

Imagine how ridiculous it would be if the proximity icons on this graphic were located on the other side of this document.





Repetition



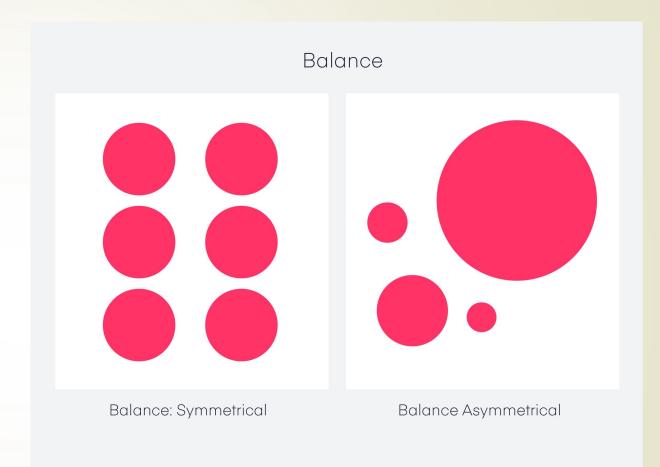
Balance

Vary graphic weight by adjusting color, contrast, size, texture, lightness, etc.

A design is considered balanced if it roughly equalizes the weight on either side of a vertical bisecting line

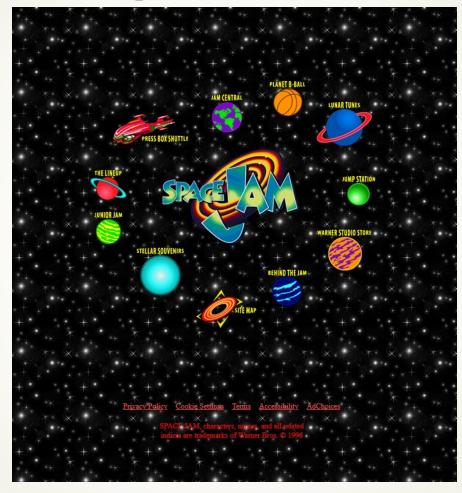
Symmetrical

Dominant Visual Element

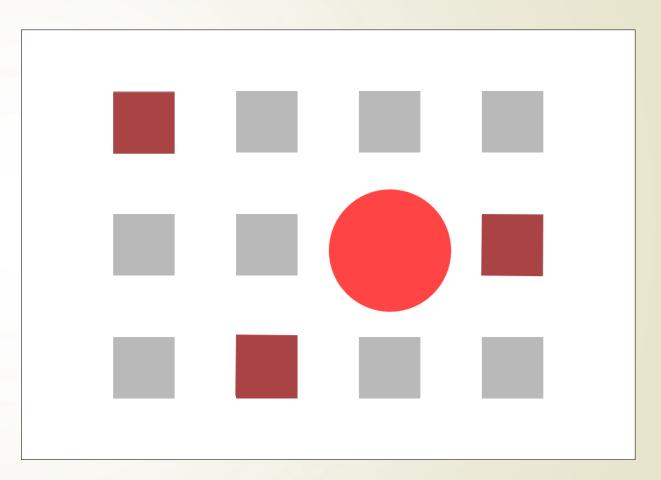
Entry point to design

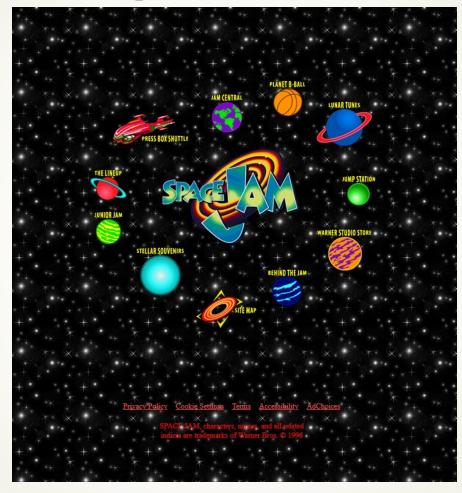

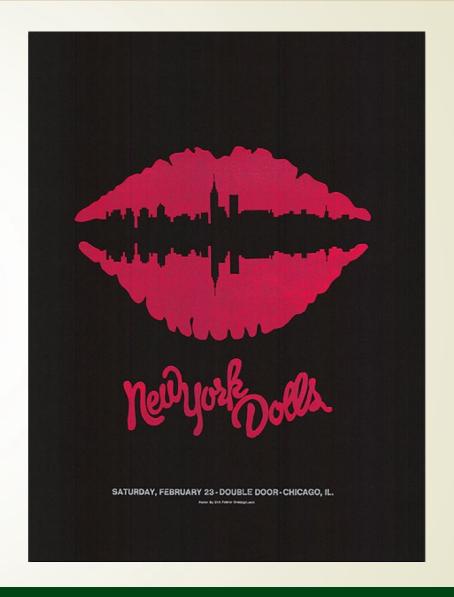
Minimal use of graphics

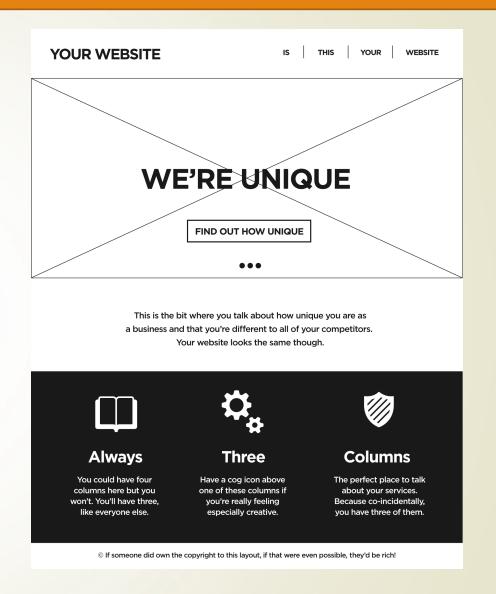
2-column, 3-column, 4-column

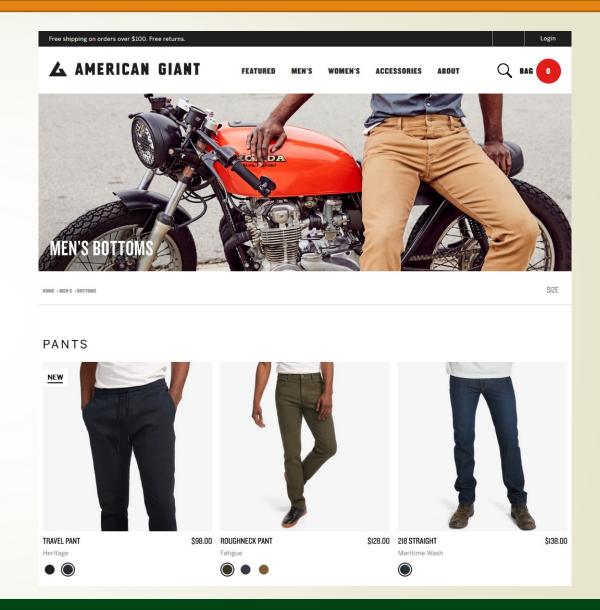

Fixed

- 900 –1200+ pixels
- 960 has many factors, but pretty narrow for current monitors

Responsive

- American-giant.com 100% width
- Often Control with max-width
- Espn.com ~ 1275px max-width

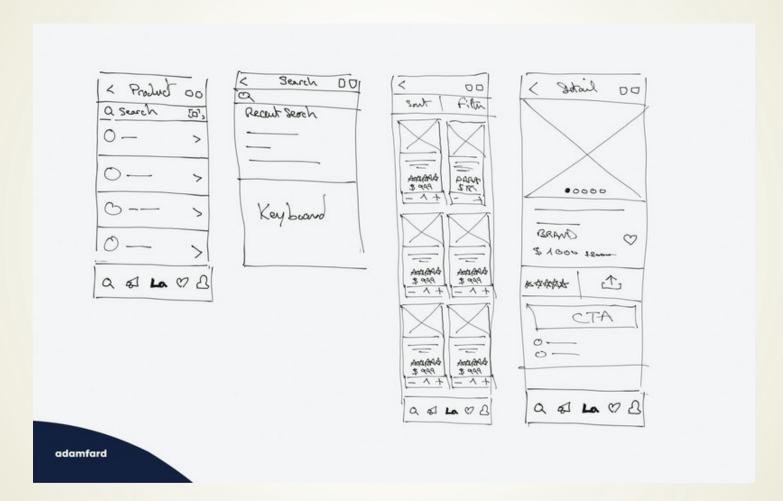
